

TELL SALESFORCE: DROP THE CBP CONTRACT

Salesforce powers the Unified Immigration Portal, which enables information sharing between ICE, CBP (Customs Border Protection), and other enforcement agencies. The system uses AI to facilitate the detentions and deportations tearing our communities apart. This contract is worth less than 0.1% of Salesforce's annual revenue and dropping it will not impact Salesforce's bottom line.

Tell Salesforce: Drop the CBP contract.

Estela lived in Los Angeles since 2016 with her 18-year-old daughter Nory after fleeing gang threats in Guatemala. On June 30, 2025, during a routine immigration check-in, ICE detained Estela and her daughter and deported them to Guatemala days later. ICE confiscated Estela's blood pressure medications. Unable to replace them in Guatemala, Estela died from untreated high blood pressure on September 8, 2025. She was 45.
